## The Pastor's Pen

|n the Gospel according to Mark, there was a moment when Jesus's family seemed very concerned about him and the work he had begun. At the end of Mark 6, he is teaching a crowd about the kingdom of God when the crowd tells him that his family wanted to see him. Jesus replies in Mark 6.34-5, "Here are my mother and my brothers! Whoever does the will of God is my brother and sister and mother."

Jesus turned family from blood relation to one formed and connected by the Spirit. Using his teaching, we understand that each of us is a part of a larger family that goes beyond our blood and/or marriage. We are covenanted together to be a family we call the First Presbyterian Church (USA) in Statesville. When each person joins our membership, he or she vows to live in relationship with this family. When we do this, and when we follow the will of God, we prove how Jesus's teaching is still correct.

We are family. Sometimes that may be difficult to feel, especially when we don't get to see one another all the time. When our one occasion to see one another may come only on Sunday for an hour or two, or during our fellowship meals, or at our Christmas Eve
Candlelight Service, we deprive the rest of the family from sharing in our joys and our sorrows. When we don't live together as family, we miss seeing children grow up in the vow we made at their baptisms to love them, nurture them, and foster them in Christian community. We don't get to hear about job changes and the nervousness or anxieties associated with them. We don't get to celebrate the end of careers at retirement. We leave words unspoken at the death of a brother or sister.

Was Jesus correct? Or is church just a club we attend when it is convenient to come to or because the people hold similar opinions, preferences, and tastes? Yes, we know Christ was right. I believe Jesus is still
spot-on. He modeled that family can be-and is sometimes even more soabout the relationships that go beyond who we know as our children, or parents, or siblings. I think family is formed when we worship God together on Sunday, drink coffee together on Tuesday, and share an offcampus meal or game together any time of the week.

Summer is a time when many of us will go our ways for vacations, yet it is also a good time for us to re-knot the ties that bind. If you haven't been to church in a while, come back. We miss you; we need you back; we want you back. Your family is here, every Sunday. The fact is that we are a family, because we're doing our best to follow God's will together, and you are important to us.

God loves you, and so do we.

## Historic Cemeteries Committee

On 30 June, 2023, Jonathan Appell, renowned cemetery preservationist/conservator, has selected Fourth Creek Burying Ground as the North Carolina location for their 48-state, 2023 tour.

This will be a workshop, inside the burying ground, teaching the proper and safe methods of cleaning headstones, in addition to some light repair. Jonathan has been conducting workshops for some time now, and is sought by many for his knowledge on the subject. One such project was in Jamestown, where he helped restore probably the oldest headstone in the United.States. Also, the Private-Public Partnership between the City of Statesville and FPC has been approved by the city, for the landscape maintenance (mowing and trimming) of Fourth Creek Burying Ground, with the city providing \$12,000/year, and FPC hiring a contractor to perform those duties as well as establish protocols for the long term preservation of this historic burying ground, where some of FPC's founders are buried.
